Recommended Packing List

The following clothing list is intended to guide you in packing for camp. The quantities specified are based upon laundry being washed once a week and taking 2 days to return. It makes no difference how long the camper is scheduled to attend camp. However, modify this list as your child's specific needs require.

CLOTHING

- 9 t-shirts
- 2 sweatshirts/sweaters
- 7 pairs of shorts
- 2 pairs of jeans
- 3 pajamas
- 10 pairs of underwear
- 10 pairs of socks
- 3 bathing suits
- 1 light weight jacket or windbreaker
- 1 hooded raincoat or poncho
- 1 belt
- 2 white t-shirts (optional, for tie-dyeing, fabric painting)
- dress clothes (optional dress for the Prom and Banquet scheduled at the end of the first and second half sessions.)

While packing, please remember extremely brief or sheer garments are not appropriate dress (mini shorts, see through clothing, etc.). The camper's underwear should be completely covered by outer clothing. Graphics that are suggestively obscene or offensive (alcohol, drugs, obscenities or words with double meanings) on any garment are prohibited and will be confiscated.

FOOTWEAR

- 2 pairs of sneakers
- 1 pair of rubber boots (for rainy weather)
- 1 pair of sandals or aqua shoes
- 1 pair of boots with a heel (required for horseback riding)
- 1 pair of dress shoes (optional for the Prom and Banquet scheduled at the end of the first and second half sessions.)

Note: flip flops & footwear not having a heel strap are discouraged due to the camp's uneven terrain.

BED AND BATH

- 2 sets of sheets (campers are required to sleep between 2 sheets.
mattress is cot-size (75"x 30"x 5"))
- 2 pillowcases
- 1 pillow (sold at camp)
- 1 blanket
- 3 bath towels
- 2 beach towels
- 2 washcloths
- 1 laundry bag
- 2 mesh bags for socks (to separate whites & darks for laundering, avoid plastic mesh bags).

TOILETRY ITEMS

- toothbrush and storage holder
- toothpaste
- liquid body soap
- hairbrush
- shampoo and conditioner
- tissues
- deodorant
- sunscreen lotion (required)
- insect repellent
- pocket size sanitizer
- face masks (reusable)
- shower caddy (optional)

PERSONAL ITEMS

- water bottle
- writing paper, envelopes, and postage stamps (it's a good idea to prepare pre-addressed, pre-stamped envelopes)
- pens and pencils
- baseball cap or visor
- sunglasses
- extra pair of prescription glasses and/or contact lenses
- books, magazines, games, cards, etc.

MISCELLANEOUS CAMP GEAR

- small desk-top fan
- small backpack or tote-bag for day trips
- flashlight with batteries

OPTIONAL ACTIVITY ITEMS

- baseball/softball glove
- skateboard (helmet, knee pads, and elbow pads must be worn when participating in this activity. Wrist guards are not mandatory, however, strongly recommended.)
- horseback riding helmet (SEI and ASTM certified) and jodhpurs (riding pants)
- tennis racket
- white t-shirt (for tie-dyeing, fabric painting) - sold at camp
- costumes and small props (for special events and evening activities)

ITEMS NOT ALLOWED ON CAMPGROUNDS

- all electronic devices capable of accessing the internet: cell phones, laptops, tablets, ipods, smart watches, TVs, DVD players
- cameras or any other device with video filming capability
- portable 2-way radios
- video game consoles (e.g. Xbox, PlayStation)

- bicycles, scooters
- curling irons, straightening irons - these items represent a fire hazard and will be confiscated.
- hot-plates, coffee machines
- refrigerators, coolers, air conditioners, large room fans
- electric blankets, space heaters
- any storage container that doesn't fit under the bed (height must be 15" or less)
- matches, lighters, fireworks, martial arts weapons, knives
- paintball guns and paintballs
- firearms, ammunition, bows, arrows, water guns
- baseball bats, softball bats
- hair clippers, hair dye
- provocative or inappropriate dress
- music with inappropriate language

PROHIBITED - IRREPLACEABLE AND EXPENSIVE ITEMS

Expensive, irreplaceable items or items with significant sentimental value (jewelry, musical instruments, etc.) need to remain at home and should not be brought to camp. If these items are brought to camp, you are responsible for them. It is understood that Lake Greeley Camp is not responsible for any item said to be damaged, lost, or stolen.

PROHIBITED - EDIBLE ITEMS (see the Care Package section in Parent Handbook)

- chewing gum
- nut products
- energy drinks
- meats and other items requiring refrigeration
- perishable foods (fresh fruits, etc.)
- cakes, cookies, candy, and other sugar-based items

PROHIBITED - OBVIOUS

Cigarettes, tobacco products, vaping pens, e-cigarettes, electronic nicotine delivery systems, narcotics, alcohol, pornography, nonalcoholic beer/wine are prohibited on campgrounds. Possession or use of these items will result in the camper's immediate dismissal from camp.

PERMITTED WITH LIMITATIONS

MP3 players (devices that cannot access the internet) can only be used inside a camper's cabin. Their use outside the cabin is not permitted as it is harmful to the camper's adjustment to camp life and reduces the camper's opportunity to interact socially with others.

Cameras with no internet or video filming capability are permitted. Photos can only be taken outdoors. Photos taken inside cabins, living quarters, bathrooms, dressing areas, the Health Center and the like are strictly prohibited.
